

DON'T POP YOUR CORK

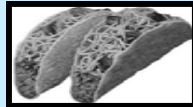
Why: To have fun as a family while learning about anger management, discipline and setting rules.



Entrance Fee: One can of soda pop per person for refreshments, which will be served at the end of the evening. As the host, you can provide cups of ice and a "munchie." Or, provide participants with a spoon and a scoop of vanilla ice cream in a tall plastic cup so that they can use their can of pop to make floats.

LET'S 'TACO' BOUT FAMILY

Why: To have fun as a family while learning about each other, opening the lines of communication and strengthening relationships between family members.



Entrance Fee: One small bag of taco chips (such as Doritos) per person or one big bag per family for walking tacos.

A LESSON IN REFUSAL SKILLS

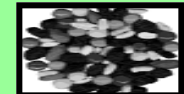
Why: To have fun as a family while learning about basic drug/alcohol skills.



Entrance Fee: Each person could bring a can of Root Beer and then Root Beer floats would be served at the end of the evening.

AN EVENING OF GORP

Why: To have fun as a family while learning about each other, celebrating differences and learning about respecting one another.



Entrance Fee: One small unopened package of M & M's, marshmallows, pretzels, breakfast cereal, peanuts, or raisins per person. (Or one large unopened box or bag of any of these items per family.) These items will be mixed together to make GORP and is served at the end of the evening.

FAMILY FUN NIGHTS

A Great Event to Encourage Family Interaction

Are you interested in providing a parent component to your drug/alcohol and violence prevention programming?

The NE Prevention Resource Center can help! Provided below are details about the programs which we offer. At family fun nights presenters will use activities that will strengthen family values, open lines of communication and promote respect for one another. We can create a night of fun around different topics and then use activities to get the point across to participants while enjoying time interacting with their family members. The presentations can be tailored to meet your needs.

Who: They can be fore elementary students or middle school students and their parents, grandparents, or other family members.

When: Usually events will last 1 to 2 hours, depending on the needs of the hosting organization.

Where: The location of the event can be a school gym, lunchroom, church or community center.

COSTS AND DETAILS:

Fee: \$50.00 (per hours of presentation) plus \$25.00 per hours of travel time, plus 37¢ per mile. These costs are negotiable. (Sometimes they can be provided for FREE!)

Other Provisions: Many schools charge no "entrance fee." Instead, they use their Safe and Drug Free Schools, or PTO funds to purchase the evening's food and beverages.

LET'S GO BANANA'S

Why: To have fun as a family while learning about each other, celebrating differences and learning about respecting one another.



Entrance Fee: One banana per person for banana splits, which will be served at the end of the evening.

GIRLS NIGHT OUT

Why: All girls seem to go through some tough times when it comes to friends and other relationships and they need the support of important women in their lives (mom's, grandma's, aunt's etc.) Plan a Girl's Night Out to learn about how communication, rumors, bullying, and teasing effect relationships and friendships and what you can do to make the school environment a better place to be. It's important that both adults and students hear this message.
